COVID-19 Testing

Information for US employees enrolled in a Lubrizol medical plan:

- Please present your medical ID card at the time of service
 - Verify the provider will send a claim for your service to UnitedHealthcare (UHC) for processing
 - If your provider will not send the claim to UHC for processing you can use your detailed statement from your visit (must include patient name, date of service, provider name and procedure code) to submit a claim yourself to UHC. Information for employees not enrolled in a Lubrizol medical plan:

- If you are not enrolled in Lubrizol's benefits, please inquire with your medical/prescription insurance carrier regarding your bill for COVID testing.

COVID-19 Vaccinations

Information for US employees enrolled in a Lubrizol medical plan:

- The vaccine is administered at no out-of-pocket cost to Lubrizol Plan participants
 - No payment should be requested at the time of service
 - The vaccine is paid for by the government and the Lubrizol Plan will pay 100% of the administration fee
- The vaccine is covered by both the medical and prescription drug plans. You can present either your medical or prescription card to all providers. For ease and accuracy of claim processing we recommend the following:
 - When receiving the vaccine at a retail pharmacy present your prescription drug (i.e. Caremark) ID card

- When receiving the vaccine at other vaccine sites (such as a hospital or doctor's office) present your medical (i.e. UnitedHealthcare) ID card
- The vaccine can be administered by both network and out of network providers and both are available at no cost to you during the public health emergency
- Many sources of information are available to the public. Among the resources available to Lubrizol Plan participants about the COVID-19 vaccine, including the benefits, risks and availability, are:

 - UnitedHealthcare has recently been made aware of increased COVID-19 vaccine-related fraud and scams
 - If someone calls, texts or emails you promising access to the COVID-19 vaccine for a fee, please do not share your personal or financial information.
 - No one should ask a you to pay to put their name on a list to get the vaccine.
 - No one should ask you to pay to get early access to a vaccine
